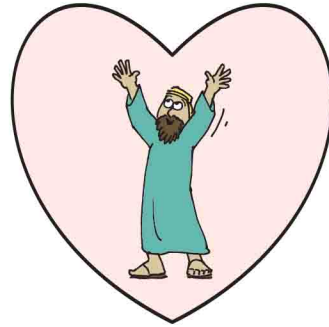
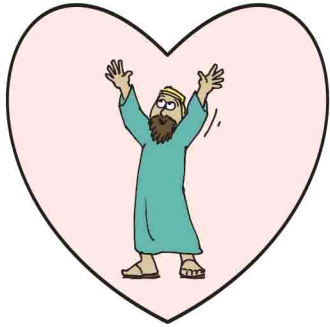

To **some** who were **confident** of their own **righteousness** and looked down on **everyone else**, **Jesus** told this **parable**: "Two men **went** up to the **temple** to **pray**, one a **Pharisee** and the **other** a tax **collector**. The **Pharisee** **stood** by himself and prayed: 'God, I **thank** you that I am not **like other people—robbers, evildoers, adulterers—or even like** this tax **collector**. I **fast** twice a week and **give** a **tenth** of all I get.' "But the tax **collector** **stood** at a distance. He would not **even look** up to heaven, but beat his breast and said, 'God, have mercy on me, a sinner.' "I tell you that this man, rather than the **other**, **went** home justified before God. For all those who **exalt** themselves will be humbled, and those who **humble** themselves will be exalted."

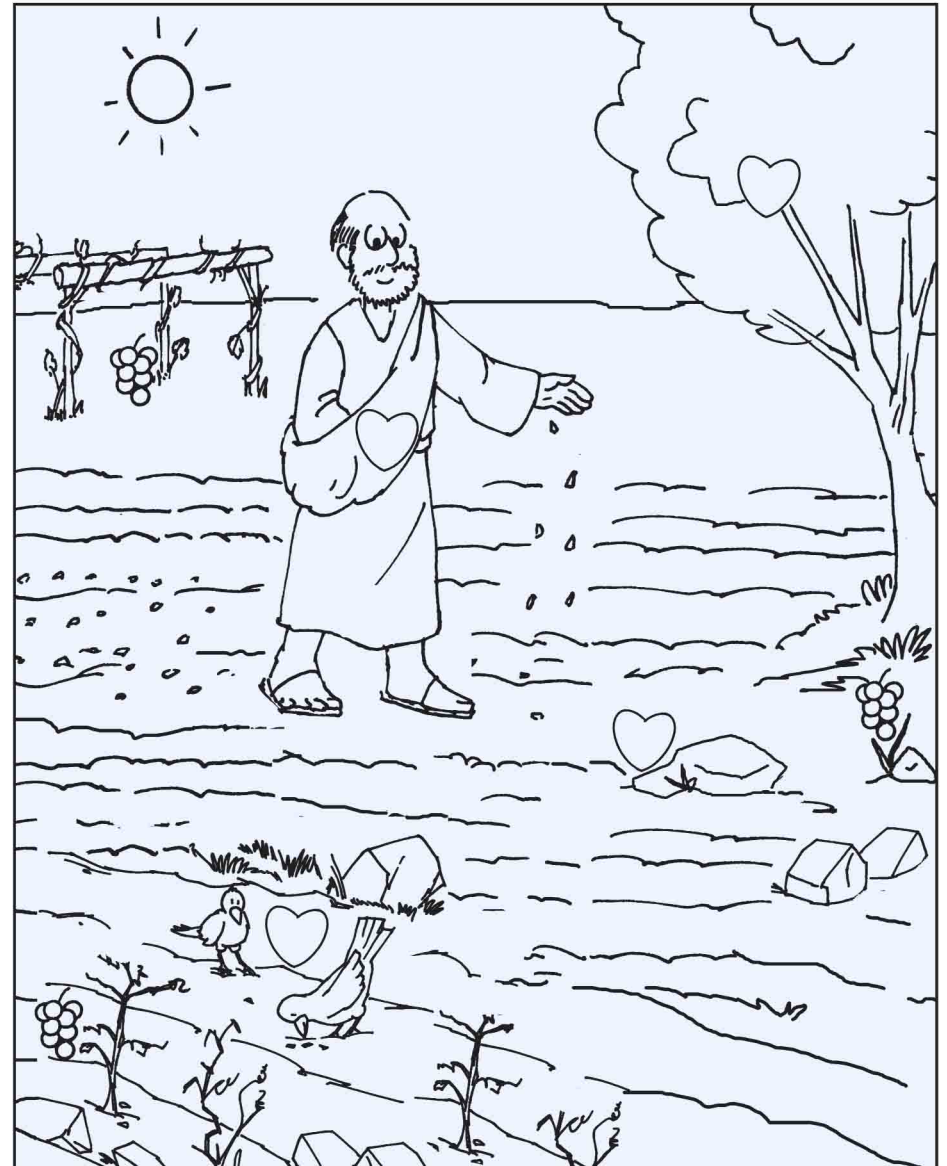
