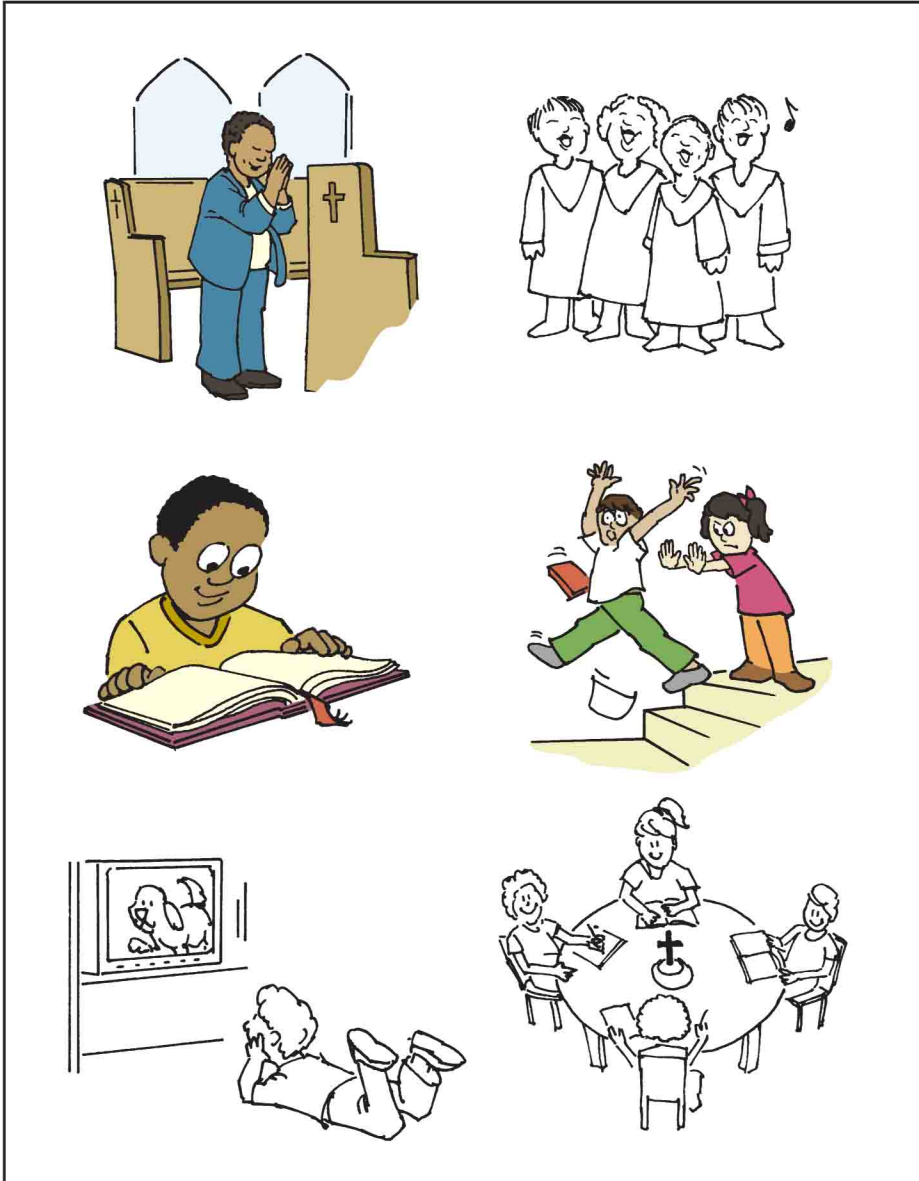

**Praise** the **LORD**, my **soul**; all my inmost **being**, **praise** his holy name. **Praise** the **LORD**, my **soul**, and **forget** not all his **benefits**— who **forgives** all your **sins** and **heals** all your **diseases**, who redeems your **life** from the pit and **crowns** you with **love** and **compassion**, who satisfies your **desires** with **good** things so that your youth is renewed **like** the **eagle's**. The **LORD** **works righteousness** and justice for all the oppressed. He made known his

ways to Moses, his deeds to the people of Israel: The **LORD** is compassionate and gracious, slow to **anger**, abounding in **love**. He will not always accuse, nor will he harbor his **anger** forever; he does not treat us as our **sins** deserve or repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his **love** for those who **fear** him; as far as the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us. As a father has **compassion** on his **children**, so the **LORD** has **compassion** on those who **fear** him; for he knows how we are formed, he remembers that we are dust. The **life** of mortals is **like** grass, they flourish **like** a flower of the field; the wind blows over it and it is gone, and its place remembers it no more. But from **everlasting** to **everlasting** the **LORD's love** is with those who **fear** him, and his **righteousness** with their **children's children**— with those who keep his covenant and **remember** to **obey** his precepts. The **LORD** has established his throne in **heaven**, and his kingdom rules over all. **Praise** the **LORD**, you his angels, you mighty ones who do his bidding, who **obey** his word. **Praise** the **LORD**, all his heavenly hosts, you his servants who do his will. **Praise** the **LORD**, all his **works** everywhere in his dominion. **Praise** the **LORD**, my **soul**.

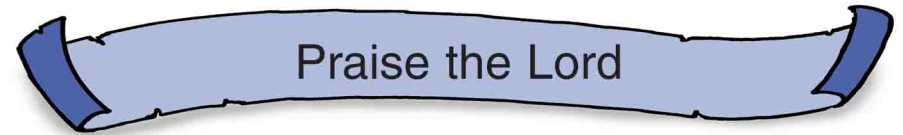

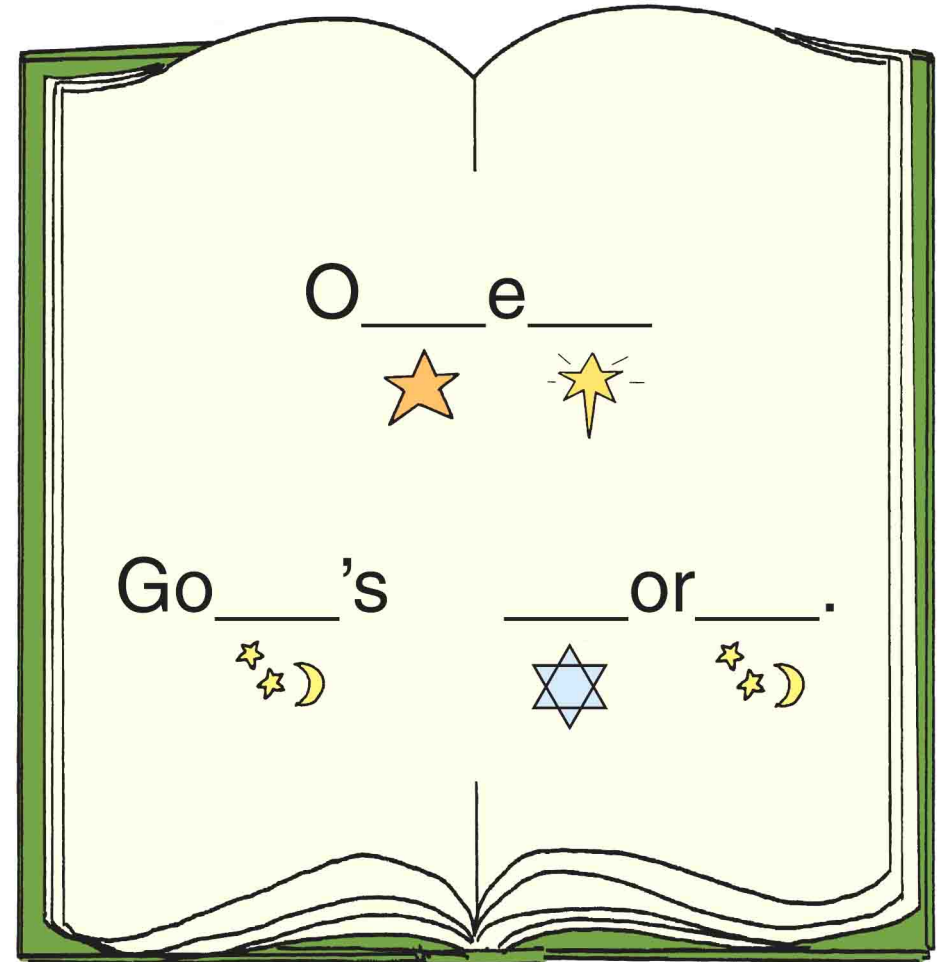

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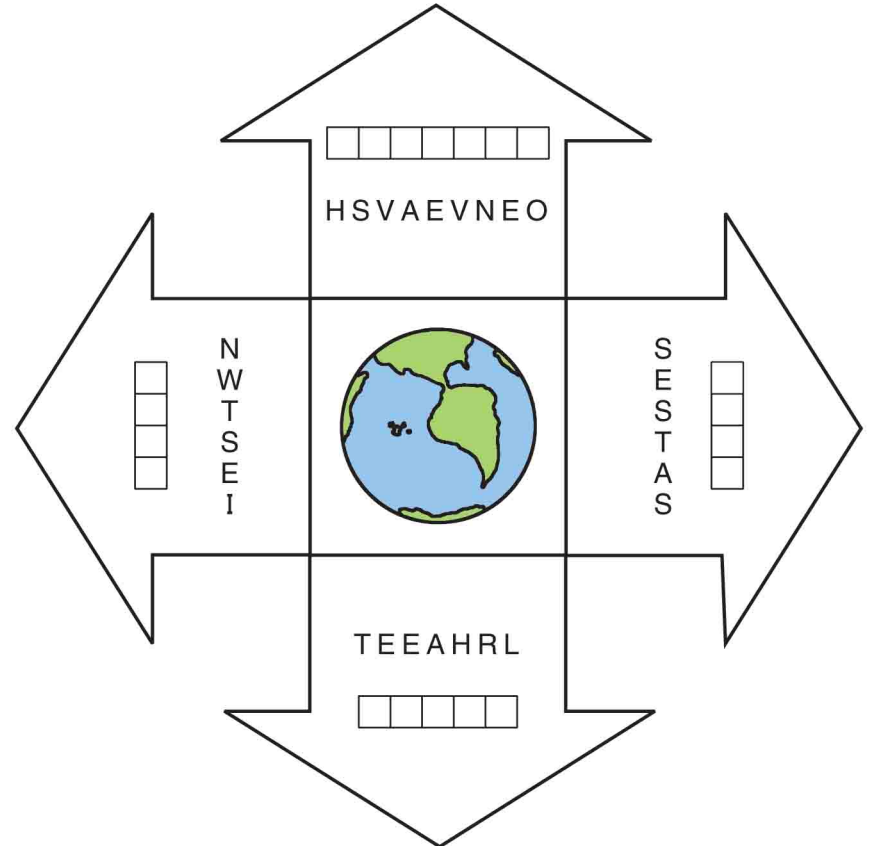
## What characteristics of God did the psalmist keep in his mind?
