Scripture Job 9:22-24; 28:12-23; 31:16-23, 35-37

28:12-23

²² It is all the same; that is why I say, 'He destroys both the blameless and the wicked.' ²³ When a scourge brings sudden death, he mocks the despair of the innocent. ²⁴ When a land falls into the hands of the wicked, he blindfolds its judges. If it is not he, then who is it?

28:12-23

¹² But where can wisdom be found? Where does understanding dwell? ¹³ No mortal comprehends its worth; it cannot be found in the land of the living. ¹⁴ The deep says, "It is not in me"; the sea says, "It is not with me." ¹⁵ It cannot be bought with the finest gold, nor can its price be weighed out in silver. ¹⁶ It cannot be bought with the gold of Ophir, with precious onyx or lapis lazuli. ¹⁷ Neither gold nor crystal can compare with it, nor can it be had for jewels of gold. ¹⁸ Coral and jasper are not worthy of mention; the price of wisdom is beyond rubies. ¹⁹ The topaz of Cush cannot compare with it; it cannot be bought with pure gold. ²⁰ Where then does wisdom come from? Where does understanding dwell? ²¹ It is hidden from the eyes of every living thing, concealed even from the birds in the sky. ²² Destruction^[a] and Death say, "Only a rumor of it has reached our ears." ²³ God understands the way to it and he alone knows where it dwells.

¹⁶ "If I have denied the desires of the poor or let the eyes of the widow grow weary, ¹⁷ if I have kept my bread to myself, not sharing it with the fatherless ¹⁸ but from my youth I reared them as a father would, and from my birth I guided the widow— ¹⁹ if I have seen anyone perishing for lack of clothing, or the needy without garments, ²⁰ and their hearts did not bless me for warming them with the fleece from my sheep, ²¹ if I have raised my hand against the fatherless, knowing that I had influence in court, ²² then let my arm fall from the shoulder, let it be broken off at the joint. ²³ For I dreaded destruction from God, and for fear of his splendor I could not do such things.
